Fondazione ICA Milano presents, from Thursday 4 May to Saturday 15 July 2023, the exhibition Ministry of Loneliness, a project by Italian artist Rebecca Moccia (1992) curated by Chiara Nuzzi.

The project is presented in the institution's project room, exceptionally relocated to the first floor of the Foundation in the space that usually houses the office. The exhibition **explores the theme of loneliness and its politicisation** starting from the collective experience of isolation experienced during the global pandemic of 2020 and is realised thanks to an Impact Grant from Outset Contemporary Art Fund - a leading international, independent charity supporting innovative art projects that engage the widest possible audiences.

Taking the experience of the Ministry of Loneliness, established in 2018 in the United Kingdom and replicated in 2021 in other countries such as Canada and Japan, as a reflexive starting point, Rebecca Moccia's exhibition explores the political and social structures that shape the emotional state of loneliness and the perception of it. The phantasmal and pervasive shadow of isolation that permeates Western societies takes shape in the artist's complex, multi-media analysis, extending to include the roots that trigger it - from the advance of the techno-scientific order of modern life to the rise of liberal capitalism.

The exhibition layout is constructed in such a way as to evoke the Office for Policy on Loneliness and Isolation of the Japanese Ministry of Loneliness, which the artist visited in Tokyo in 2021. The environment contributes to engaging the visitor in an immersive atmosphere that evokes the bureaucratization and administration of feelings, within which the artist's works find their ideal place. The film *Ministries of Loneliness*, central work of the whole project produced by Careof in collaboration with Fondazione ICA Milano, the series of thermographs *How Cold As You Are*, which give an emotional reportage of places, bodies and situations encountered by the artist, to the ceramic works that formalise the *Loneliness Scale*, the scale developed by the University of California in 1978 to assess the level of loneliness of a subject and used by the artist as a tool with different functions during her research, articulate the dialogue between Moccia's work, the spaces of Fondazione ICA Milano and the sound composition **realised by Renato Grieco**, **sound artist involved** by Moccia especially for the occasion. The exhibition will also be accompanied by a **book co-published by Fondazione ICA Milano and presented by 2023.**

THE ARTIST

Rebecca Moccia was born in Naples in 1992. She lives and works in Milan. In her transdisciplinary practice, Moccia explores the materiality of perceptive and emotive states that can emerge from specific social and spatial characteristics, creating installations conceived as mobile assemblages made up of different elements. Moccia's works have been presented in solo and collective exhibitions in several institutions, such as: Jupiter Woods, London; Italian Cultural Institute, Brussels; Museo Novecento, Florence; Fondazione Morra Greco, Naples; Castro Project, Rome; Toast Project Space, Manifattura Tabacchi, Florence; MACRO Museum, Rome; Academie Youth Art Biennale, Brixen; Museo d'Arte Contemporanea di Villa Croce, Genoa; ENSBA, Lyon. In 2022, Moccia won the international research grant promoted by the Ministry of Culture (Directorate-General for Contemporary Creativity) within the program Italian Council, with her project Ministry of Loneliness. The project was realized in collaboration with Outset UK, Jupiter Woods, Magazzino Italian Art, Embassy of Italy in Tokyo, Nanzan University and Fondazione ICA Milano. It included residences in London (U.K.), New York (U.S.), and Nagoya (Japan).

Rebecca Moccia is among the founding members of AWI – Art Workers Italia.

THE CURATOR

Curator and researcher, Chiara Nuzzi (Naples, 1986) graduated in Art History at Cà Foscari University of Venice, where she also gained her Master in Production and Organization of Visual Arts at IUAV University. In 2012 she attended the first edition of the program for young Italian curators CAMPO, held by the Fondazione Sandretto Re Rebaudengo in Turin and in 2014-2015 she completed the research program CuratorLab for international curators at Konstfack University of Stockholm, Sweden. She worked for several private and public institutions including: ar/ge kunst, Bolzano; MART Museum, Trento and Rovereto; Independent Art Fair, Brussels; Thankyouforcoming, Nice, Biennale Gherdeina, Ortisei. Since 2018 she is the curator and editorial manager of Fondazione ICA Milano, for which she collaborates on the exhibition, educational and editorial programme. She is currently guest curator for the Project Room program 2023 at Fondazione Arnaldo Pomodoro in Milan. In 2015 she co-founded the Florentine festival SONIC SOMATIC focusing on contemporary sound and performance research, of which she is still co-curator.

FONDAZIONE ICA MILANO

Fondazione ICA Milano - Istituto Contemporaneo per le Arti is a private non-profit foundation dedicated to contemporary arts and culture, research and experimentation, in which different forces and types of protagonists of the art world converge artists, collectors, professionals, enthusiasts.

Directed by Alberto Salvadori, ICA is the first Contemporary Arts Institute outside the Anglo-Saxon world, located in the former industrial area of Via Orobia in Milan. The Institute's activity takes the form of an offer to the city and the public, where sharing and participation are the key words to understand its attitude. Exhibitions, art publishing, ceramics, cinema, performances, music, literature, seminar activities for dissemination, training, education, and much more will build a path marked by interdisciplinarity and transmediality. Expression of a precise 'Milanese' identity that historically links private initiative with the institutional dimension, ICA finds inspiration in the culture of giving back, that is, giving back to share.
